RULES- Video must:

- Be at least 15 seconds and under 3 minutes long
- Show positive/ healthy activities and interests- Not promote the use of drugs or alcohol
- Be developed by youth (age 14-24)
- Not promote or defame any brand, logo, names of companies or organizations
- Not show any illegal activity, profanity, sex or direct attack on people or organizations
- Submit the video via a link to your uploaded YouTube video to odacinformation@gmail.com or contact this email to discuss other ways of submitting
- Submit video **before Friday, April 27, 2018**

Judging Criteria: Every effort will be made to have the videos judged by youth within our community:

- Level of creativity
- Was the message clear- showed how their interests or future goal would not be effected by drugs or alcohol?
- How well was the story developed and message delivered?
- Depicted a positive role model- in other words all messages being sent within the video promoted safe, healthy and positive activities (example: helmets worn when biking or skateboarding)
- Was the use of actors/presenters/animations appropriate?
- Was the camera work well done?
- Was the video understandable? Was the audio well done and level throughout the film?
