

Position: Mental Health and Addictions Re-Design Coordinator

Position Summary

Reporting to Addiction Services of Thames Valley, the Mental Health and Addictions Re-design Coordinator will work closely with the South West LHIN Mental Health and Addictions Program Lead and the Coordinator of the Middlesex-London Community Drug and Alcohol Strategy (CDAS) to provide key leadership and support for the redesign of Mental Health and Addictions care and the implementation of priority treatment focused recommendations of the Middlesex-London CDAS, in collaboration with stakeholders, clients and other system partners.

The Re-design Coordinator will work collaboratively with members of the South West LHIN, CDAS Steering Committee, Middlesex London Health Unit and health service partners to ensure coordination of improvement strategies with other change initiatives led by the South West LHIN. The Coordinator will engage and collaborate with local organizations, clinicians, health service providers, clients and other partners in implementing and monitoring improvement initiatives.

Duties & Responsibilities

- Works within community partnerships and guiding large projects within a partnership model
- Serves as a leader responsible for identifying, developing and implementing large and complex, South West LHIN catchment area wide projects aimed at redesigning the Mental Health and Addictions system within the broader health system to achieve improved patient experience, better health outcomes, improved provider experience, and best use of resources.
- Serves as the lead for the treatment pillar focused workgroup(s) of the CDAS including identifying and mobilizing membership, chairing meetings, ensuring collaborative process among workgroup members and ensuring effective communication between the workgroup(s) and the CDAS Coordinator and Steering Committee
- Supports, advances and implements priority treatment pillar focused recommendations identified in the CDAS in collaboration with CDAS partners and with guidance from the CDAS Steering Committee
- Attend and participate in South West LHIN catchment area drug and alcohol strategy tables
- Establishes and maintains effective working relationships with health and social service providers, clinicians, and other partners to adopt best practice approaches and initiate action plans for health system improvement.
- Contributes to the development of organizational and provider capability to support system improvement objectives

- Provides leadership and oversight to stakeholders involved in improving mental health and addictions care in the London Middlesex
- As appropriate, provides input into the process to set performance expectations, determine methods and tools to monitor and evaluate Health Service Provider performance from multiple perspectives including quality of care and service provision

The successful candidate will have knowledge of:

- the impacts of the determinants of health in impacting mental health and addictions
- health equity strategies, including the needs of Indigenous peoples (urban and community), Francophone communities, and people with lived experience
- the Ontario health sector and trends within the London Middlesex Mental Health and Addictions sector local health issues, priorities and needs..
- the value of an integrated four pillar approach, including prevention, treatment, harm reduction and enforcement, in understanding and addressing substance use related harm

- Completion of a Masters in Social Work or equivalent degree i.e. Master's in Public Health

- Ability to travel within the South West LHIN catchment area
